



Year 2 Newsletters - Spring Term



What we have been learning this term:

English – We have had special visit from the real (!) Goldilocks and we have written our own story sequel 'Goldilocks and just one Bear'. We enjoyed the 'Jim and the Beanstalk' story and we have written our own versions. Most recently some endangered animals left some footprints in our classroom which led us to a story called 'The Journey Home'.

Reading – We have been focusing on applying our phonics knowledge when reading and spelling words. We have used skills of prediction to think about what we think will happen next in our class stories as well as making inferences about what we think the characters are thinking or feeling.

Maths – We started the year by looking at the place value of numbers and counting forwards and backwards to 100. We also spent some time telling the time: o'clock, half past, quarter past and quarter to. Recently, we have done some work on 2D and 3D shapes: naming them and recognising their properties such as number of sides, edges, vertices and faces.

Science – We have been very busy in science this term! We have spent lots of time looking at different living (or non-living) things and using our scientific skills to identify similarities and differences. We have also categorised animals, electrical appliances and sounds by our own criteria.

Art – We have been studying the artwork of artist Van Gogh. We noticed how he used dots and different types of lines to create different textures before creating our own drawings of the year 2 garden using these techniques. We really enjoyed sharing these art journeys with you last week!

History – We have been learning about the explorers Christopher Columbus and Neil Armstrong. We loved comparing their different journeys using a storyboard and thinking about which journey we would have preferred to go on, learning about the food that they would have eaten on the journeys as well as deciding who we thought was the bravest explorer Columbus or Armstrong. Who do you think was the bravest?

Geography – We have been learning about the area of Southampton. We named and located the landmarks in our city and compared them to famous landmarks in London. We also compared the rivers and ports in Southampton with other U.K. cities.

PSHE – We have been learning about our mental health and well-being. We have discussed different emotions and what we can do to help us improve a negative emotion. We discussed our choices and if they were healthy and we discussed our community, and which trusted adults keep us safe.

RE – This term in RE we have been learning about Journeys. We shared our own experiences of journeys that we had been on and why they were special or exciting for us. We read the story of Baboushka's journey to meet Jesus and ended the unit with our 'Question of faith' day where we learnt about the Nativity journeys of Mary and Joseph, the Wise men and the Shepherds.

Computing – We have been learning how to collect, input, read and interpret data.

PE – At the beginning of term we learned some different gymnastic shapes and put them into sequences with balances and different ways of travelling. More recently, we have been learning a dance based on the music of Aladdin.

Music – Christmas play. We have been learning the words and actions to songs for our Nativity performance – 'Miracle in Town'.

DT – We have researched, designed, built and evaluated our own vehicles.



This half term's optional home-learning project:

In Computing, we learned about collecting data in a tally and then presenting it in a pictogram. Could you collect your own data (for example, what animals you see outside, or what is the favourite food of each of your family members) and present it as a pictogram?

Next half term, we will be learning...

<u>Subject</u>	<u>Learning</u>
Reading	We will be continuing to practise reading fluently as well as answering inference questions based on our class stories.
Writing	We will write our own stories based on the journey home before reading and exploring bear themed books 'The bear under the stairs' and 'The bear and the piano'.
Maths	We will learn to use our place value knowledge of tens and ones to add and subtract 2 two-digit numbers. We will also look at money – we will recognise the value of different coins and find different ways of making amounts.
Science	We will learn more about plants. We will categorise them into groups according to their different features and how they grow. We will also learn more about animals and their habitats.
PSHE	We will learn about our relationships with different people and how we respect peoples' differences as well as understanding when it is ok to say no to our friends.
RE	We will learn about the concept of remembering through finding out about the Hindu religion and their God Vishnu.
History	We will learn about the famous nurse Florence Nightingale and how she changed hospitals and nursing standards. We will also have a visit from a real nurse who will answer our questions.
DT	We will use our DT skills to research, design, sew and evaluate felt finger puppets.
Computing	We will be learning about digital photography and using the iPads to take portrait and landscape photos as well as looking at the different effects you can use to enhance photos.
Music	We will continue to learn how to sing and learn different melodies and repeat rhythms as well as listening to and enjoying different types of music.
