



School Uniform Policy



Harefield Primary School

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1 The purpose of this policy

Pupils wear school uniform to promote pride and a sense of belonging to Harefield Primary School

2 Aims and objectives

The aims of our school uniform policy are:

- To promote pride in our school and a sense of identity.
- To create a sense of community and belonging.
- To ensure pupils wear clothing and shoes to school which are safe, smart and practical.
- To make pupils feel equal to their peers in terms of appearance.
- To make pupils aware of acceptable/appropriate clothing for different occasions and purposes.
- To ensure the uniform is regarded as good value for money by most parents/carers.
- To ensure pupils of our school are easy to identify.
- To promote freedom of choice of items of uniform for all genders/how an individual chooses to identify.

Harefield Primary School does not require any of its pupils to wear any item of clothing that has the school logo branding. We recognise and acknowledge that this can be costly, therefore it is down to parents/carers personal preference.

3 Our Uniform

- Grey or black skirts, trousers, shorts or pinafore dress
- White blouses, shirts or polo shirts
- White or red t-shirts
- Red and white checked or striped summer dress
- Red school cardigan, jumper or fleece
- Black shoes or black trainers (no sandals or boots)
- Articles of clothing that are to be worn as part of a religious faith are permitted.
- No jewellery apart from stud earrings and watch (not watches with a camera or able to make accept calls/texts) is permitted.
- No make-up of any kind is permitted.
- No dyed hair or extreme haircuts are permitted

4 PE Kits and Expectations

- All children should bring a clean PE kit to school each Monday and this should remain on their peg till Friday when it can be taken home for washing. This means that children will have a PE kit available to use for both indoor and outdoor PE.
- White or red t-shirt
- Black shorts or red/black leotard
- Plimsolls/trainers
- Tracksuit/fleece or suitable outdoor clothing for PE outside

All PE kit should be clearly labelled and not include expensive branded items. It should be sent to school in a clearly labelled PE bag. The school accepts no responsibility for PE kit that is lost.

5 Health and Safety

- We request that no jewellery is worn at school.
- Watches worn to school on PE days will be removed and stored in the classroom box during PE
- If a child wears stud earrings to school on a PE day and is unable to remove these themselves, they will be taped over.
- All pupils with long hair should have their hair tied up



The school accepts no responsibility for loss theft or damage to any items of jewellery.

6 Actions the school will take if a child fails to wear the correct uniform

1. The class teacher will try to find an appropriate piece of uniform for the pupil to change into and speak to the parent/carer at the end of the school day either on the playground or by telephone
2. The class teacher will complete a slip identifying which item of uniform is not correct and send this home in a sealed envelope with a copy of the school's Uniform policy.
3. The class teacher will arrange a meeting with themselves, the parent/carer and Phase Leader to discuss the barriers to the pupil wearing the correct school uniform.
4. The class teacher will complete a 'tracker' which may be shared with external agencies if deemed necessary by the school's Designated Safeguard Leads (DSLs)

7 Buying School Uniform

8 Assistance with School Uniform

Appendix 1: Incorrect School Uniform Slip
